Malaria kills a child somewhere in the world every 30 seconds...you can help!

Imagine you're lying in bed. Your one-room house sits surrounded by rice and grasslands - one of the most beautiful places on earth is Southeast Asia.

The blackness outside is too dark to see as there is no electricity. All your senses can make out are the sounds of the night. You can hear a dog, the sound of a cow off in the distance, and the small orphaned children are sound asleep on the floor next to you, worn out from a hard day at the rice paddy near the house.

All of a sudden, the sound you fear the most: a faint buzz that seems to be coming from nowhere. Then, it's silent. You tense. It starts again – this time closer, near your head. Then, it's silent again. You pray as you have so many times before - asking God to protect the orphans.

A Simple Answer

As we approach the monsoon season again, the rain will begin on or about June 1st and end mid-October. Each year the rains come and so do the carriers of malaria. On an average 4 children sleep under one mosquito net. Over the last 6 years we have purchased these nets for the children, but our nets have been used so much and repaired so often that the time to replace them is now at a cost of **\$10.00 each**. With over **400 orphans** in Burma, Cambodia, and India we will require over **\$1,000.00**. The nets need to be treated with repellent every 30 to 60 days. The repellent will add another **\$400.00** to the cost of protection. Just one child staying in the hospital and medicine could cost more than the nets and repellent.
